NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA

All Government and non-Government schools across Australia are required to participate annually in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD).

All Australian schools will collect data on their students who are receiving adjustments to meet additional learning

and support needs in accordance with their obligations under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and *Disability Standards for Education 2005*. This data will be provided to the Australian Government to assist in the development of a consistent, national picture of the educational needs of students with disability. A disability does not require a formal diagnosis.

Adjustments may include, but are not limited to: differentiation and modification of the curriculum; support from School Learning Support Officers (SLSO); support from Learning and Support Teacher (either individually or in a group) and support from additional school funding. Through communication with your child's classroom teacher during Family Conferences, interviews, notification from our Learning Support Team and student reports you will be aware if your child receives additional support with their learning.

The data given to the Australian Government by the NSW Department of Education and Communities is provided in such a way that it cannot be used to identify any individual student or school.
