## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear parents, carers and community members,

### KINDERGARTEN 2018

It is hard to believe that it is already time to start considering and planning for Kindergarten 2018.

### NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA

All Government and non-Government schools across Australia are required to participate annually in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD).

All Australian schools will collect data on their students who are receiving adjustments to meet additional learning and support needs in accordance with their obligations under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and *Disability Standards for Education 2005*.

This data will be provided to the Australian Government to assist in the development of a consistent, national picture of the educational needs of students with disability. A disability

does not require a formal diagnosis.

Adjustments may include, but are not limited to: differentiation and modification of the curriculum; support from School Learning Support Officers (SLSO); support from Learning and Support Teacher (either individually or in a group) and support from additional school funding. Through communication with your child's classroom teacher during Family Conferences, interviews, notification from our Learning Support Team and student reports you will be aware if your child receives additional support with their learning.

The data given to the Australian Government by the NSW Department of Education and Communities is provided in such a way that it cannot be used to identify any individual student or school.

## CHANGES TO OUR SCHOOLS FINANCE AND STUDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

Our school will soon be migrating to the new Department of Education state wide program for financial and student administration management called Learning Management and Business Reform or LMBR.

We are currently going through many transition processes to facilitate this change which will see some different ways of operating from our office side of things.

The systems we are using today are outdated, and don't support our current or future needs.

The Learning Management and Business Reform (LMBR) program will address these needs with new, integrated systems that will support the vital work of staff at schools across NSW.

The LMBR program will deliver schools with modern finance, student management and student wellbeing systems that will provide all NSW Public Schools with an integrated set of tools designed to help staff deliver the best possible outcomes for the students and communities they serve.

The program is delivering modern, integrated IT systems to better support the many aspects of teaching and learning in NSW Public Schools. The new systems will transform the way we work to provide flexibility, efficiency and sustainability across the Department. It is not just about technology, but about changing the way we work as a school and as a school community as a whole.

Modernising school systems across NSW allows for:

- ◆ a consistent way for all schools to manage financial and student data
- ◆ portability of wellbeing and learning data so each student's information follows them when they change schools
- ◆ improved collaboration between teachers, students and parents and carers around a student's learning continuum.

Once deployed to our school, the LMBR systems will deliver some immediate benefits, and when fully integrated across all schools, other benefits will be realised.

The new student management systems will enable consistent access to student learning, wellbeing and engagement records as a student moves schools throughout their public education. This provides greater visibility and personalisation of students' learning plans, and enhances teamwork and engagement between teachers and parents and carers.

Mrs Groves, Ms Gilman and Mrs Wild will be receiving extensive training over the next few months and the school will "Go Live" in the new system on 4th September this year.
