## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members,

### EDUCATION WEEK 'I LEARN -WE LEARN'

We are very excited about our plans for our Open day next FRIDAY 4<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST. Please join us for our concert starting at 9:30 am, stay for morning tea and then join your child(ren) in our school family groups for five engaging and exciting activities. We will have lunch together at the conclusion of the activities. Our canteen will be offering lots of delicious food and drinks for purchase including a BBQ lunch. Our Book Fair will be available throughout the day.

### CYBER SAFETY

We have been granted some funds to present a cyber safety program to Year 4, 5 and 6 students. Mrs Manning is delivering the program as a component of our PD H PE syllabus. Each Friday students will participate in a workshop called *Cyberecho* and investigate cyber safety issues. The program will run for six weeks.

### INCREASED STAFFING

We have increased our enrolment numbers after the break and have seen our entitlement increase by an additional teacher until the end of the year. We deemed it too late in the year to restructure classes and have implemented a variety of programs using this entitlement. Kindergarten will receive an extra day of support, students will participate in Maths exploration days, additional learning support will be able to continue for Maths in stage 2 & 3 and Literacy support in stage 1. Teachers will be released to participate in collegial planning, Family Conferences, program evaluation and policy development.

### AIR CONDITIONING

We completed our air-conditioning for all rooms during the holidays. We thank the P & C who funded the stage 1 rooms from school fees and Walk-a-thon collections. We raised over \$2500 from the walk-a-thon (not too late to send in any monies you have collected) and nearly 50% of our families paid their voluntary contributions.

All students in K-2 will be invited to attend a special performance by Gigalees Crazy Circus next week. There is no charge.

## MEDICAL MATTERS

### WHOOPING COUGH (PERTUSSIS)

We have had a reported case of whooping cough in a student at our school. Please refer to the following information for parents/carers.

*Time from Exposure to Illness*  
7 to 20 days

#### *Symptoms*

Starts with a runny nose, followed by a persistent cough that comes in bouts. Bouts may be followed by vomiting and a whooping sound as the child gasps for air. Older children and adults may just have a cough that lasts for many weeks and may not have the whoop.

*If my child has Whooping Cough do I need to keep my child at home?*

Yes, until the first 5 days of a special antibiotic have been taken. If the child has not received any antibiotic treatment then the child should be kept away from school for 3 weeks from the onset of the "whoop".

#### *Controlling the spread of infection*

Immunisation at 2, 4, and 6 months and 4 years of age. A special antibiotic can be given for the patient and close contacts. Unimmunised contacts may be excluded from school or child care until the first 5 days of a special antibiotic has been taken.

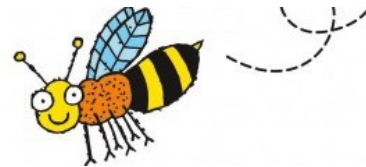

## Information for parents, guardians and students

Our school has partnered with Transport for NSW to use the new online School Portal for endorsing school travel applications and submitting School Drive Subsidy and Private Vehicle Conveyance Scheme attendance checks.

You are now able to manage all your school travel needs online including applying for school travel passes, tracking the status of your application and tracking the status of your School Drive Subsidy application and payments.

The application process has also been simplified so that a new or updated application for school travel passes is only needed when a student is:

- applying for a school travel pass for the first time
- requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).
- changing school or campus
- changing home address
- receiving an expiry notification
- repeating a school year
- changing their name
- requesting a new transport operator.

This means students who are progressing to year 3 and year 7 only need to reapply if they are changing circumstances.

Students who are not residents and are temporarily in Australia can also provide their visa subclass number or exchange program when applying online, making the application and approval process much faster.

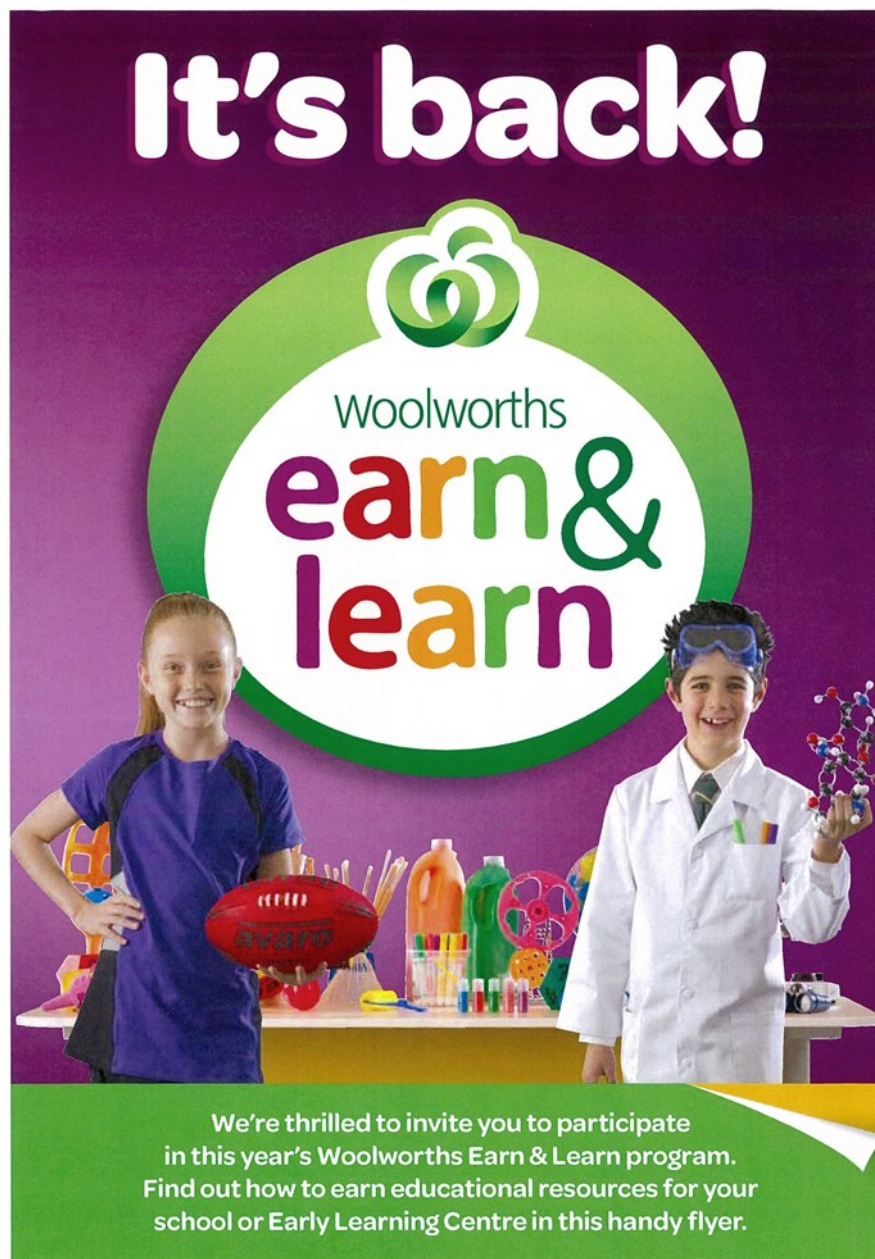
