Information About the Zones of Regulation

Next term, students will be participating in the Zones of Regulation curriculum, which are lessons and activities designed by Leah Kuypers, licensed occupational therapist, to help students gain skills in the area of self-regulation. Staff will be undertaking training on our School Development Day next term.

Self-regulation can go by many names, such as self-control, self-management, and impulse control. It is defined as the best state of alertness of both the body and emotions for the specific situation. For example, when a students plays in the playground or in a competitive game, it is beneficial to have a higher state of alertness. However, that same state would not be appropriate in the library.

The lessons and learning activities are designed to help the students recognise when they are in the different Zones, as well as learn how to use strategies to change or stay in the Zone they are in.

In addition to addressing selfregulation, the students will gain an increased vocabulary of emotional terms, skills in reading other people's facial expressions, perspective about how others see and react to their behaviour, insight into events that trigger their behaviour, calming and alerting strategies, and problem solving skills.
