Staff at NHPS are currently undertaking extensive Professional Learning to support all student's social and emotional development, including the teaching of responsible behaviour. The learning is based on 'Choice Theory' (William Glasser). Our approach at North Haven Public School is to support student's social and emotional development, including the teaching of responsible behaviour.

Students are explicitly taught, consistently guided and supported to learn how to satisfy their own

needs in a responsible manner. At NHPS we are learning and recognising that all behaviour is purposeful and that students will always be behaving in ways to attempt to satisfy their own personal needs. It is our role to support students, through care and genuine concern to help them to understand what needs they are attempting to satisfy and teach them how this can be done in a responsible manner. Alternate behaviour choices need to be taught with ongoing support, feedback and encouragement offered to the student.



Balancing the lunchbox

Making a healthy lunchbox can be easy and fun – especially if you get the kids involved!

What are the building blocks of a balanced lunchbox?

Use this guide as a starting point and get creative with your children to mix it up. You might like to build a mighty sandwich that covers a few of the food groups, or pack things separately, bento-box style, for your child to construct at school.

- 1 serving of protein (lean meats, 1 cup legumes (beans, chickpeas, lentils), 2 eggs)
- 1 serving of vegetables (1 cup of salad)
- 1 serving of fruit (1 whole fruit or 1 cup tinned fruit)
- 1 serving of wholegrains (1 slice bread or ½ cup pasta)
- 1 serving of dairy or dairy alternative (1 cup milk or 2 slices cheese)

Tips for fussy eaters

Getting kids involved in choosing and making their lunch may help fussy eaters and stop food ending up in the bin. If leftovers do come home, try encouraging your kids to eat them for afternoon tea or use them up in dinner (like carrot sticks).

Top tips include:

- \checkmark Lead by example, try to share the enjoyment of healthy food with your children.
- ✓ Get kids involved in lunchmaking kids tend to eat if they can serve themselves or help with food preparation.
- Meal plan/shop together giving kids some choice over what they are eating can help foster their sense of independence.
- Make meals and snacks interesting by including different colours, shapes and textures.
- ✓ Try not to give in with preferred foods because "they have to eat something".
- Praise efforts and try to ignore unwelcome behaviour.


